MAJOR FUNDING BOOST FOR GROVES CHRISTIAN COLLEGE

Commonwealth funding to Groves Christian College includes:

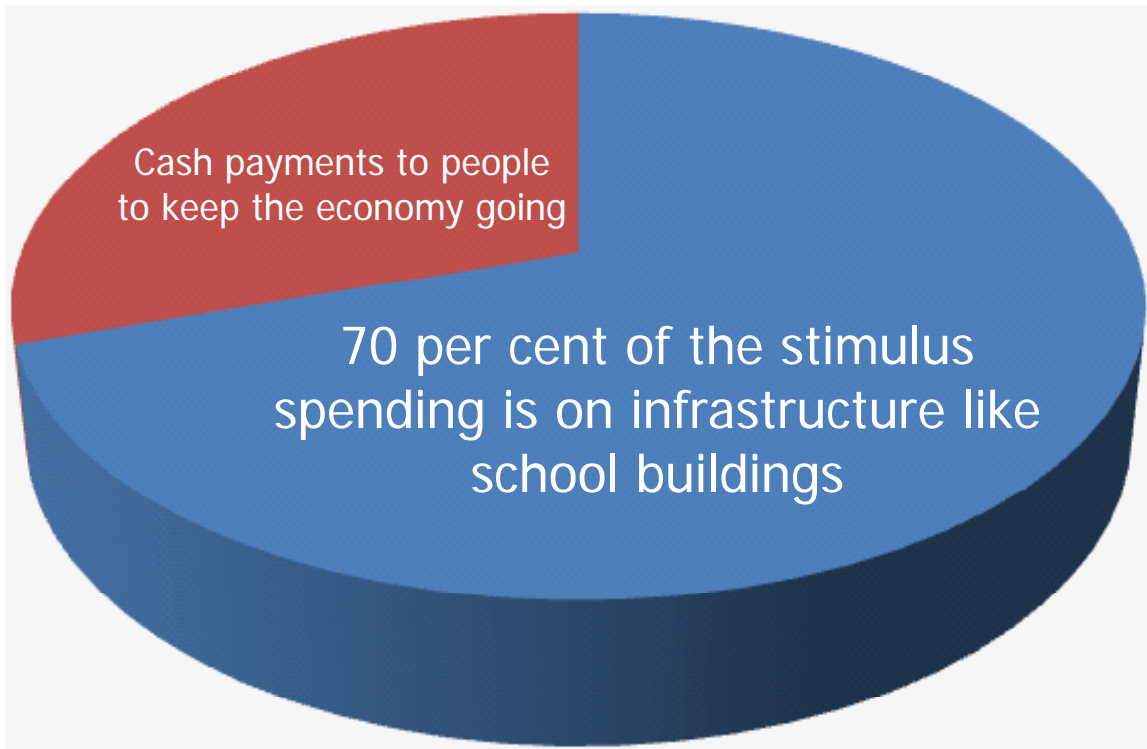
- \$2.2 million to build a multipurpose centre for student use (now under construction)
- \$800,000 to build four primary school classrooms (now under construction)
- \$200,000 from the National School Pride Program to refurbish students' bathrooms, paint the administration building and expand the library (completed)
- \$60,000 for the School Chaplaincy Program.

As your local Member of Parliament I will continue to make sure schools in Logan City get their fair share of the Rudd Government's nation-building economic stimulus funding.

THE ECONOMIC STIMULUS PACKAGE



You've probably heard about the Economic Stimulus Package which kept Australia safe from the worst of the global recession.

But did you know that most of the money is being spent on school buildings to ensure our kids have access to the best facilities?

This spending is not just an investment in the future of our kids — it is putting money into the pockets of our tradies and small business people to keep the economy bubbling along.

Seventy per cent of the money in the Economic Stimulus Package is being spent on infrastructure — that is, on vital school buildings and other community resources.

That means we will have better, stronger communities after the world economy recovers.

In our area, more than \$107 million is being spent to improve our schools and provide other new buildings.

Every primary school has received up to \$3 million to build a new hall or other much-needed facilities.

And there are three new trade training centres costing almost \$6 million to make sure the next generation of tradies is on the way.

EDUCATION TAX REFUND

From 1 July 2010 you can claim the Education Tax Refund for eligible education spending from 1 July 2009 to 30 June 2010.

This means you could get 50% back on a range of primary and secondary school education expenses.

Remember to keep your receipts. They will help you calculate your refund and you may be required to show them as proof of purchase. You can claim:

- Up to \$780 for each primary school child — giving you up to \$390 for each primary school child you have, and
- Up to \$1,558 for each secondary school child — giving you up to \$779 for each secondary school child.
